ABSTRACT

Background: According to the data of the Indonesian Child Protection Commission in 2018 victims of violence and bullying accounted for 22.3% and the perpetrators of violence and bullying amounted to 25.5%. Based on interviews with several street children at independent shelters they once poured water on grandmothers on the street, throwing stones at grandparents who were cycling and there were victims of sexual violence.

Purpose : To find out the description of bullying behavior on street children in an independent shelter in Yogyakarta.

Method: This type of research is descriptive research, sampling techniques using total sampling. Data collection is done from filling out the questionnaire, and is done in Microsoft Excel and data analysis is done according to the formula.

Result: Of the 35 respondents that the physical bullying behavior of children in shelters was in the high category with the results of child respondents experiencing blows with the number of respondents 35 (100.0%), verbal bullying behavior of respondents was in the high category with angry behavior with 30 respondents (85.71%).

Conclusion: Bullying behavior on street children in independent shelters includes physical bullying behavior as well as verbal bullying behavior in the high category.
