

HUBUNGAN DUKUNGAN SUAMI DENGAN KEPATUHAN IBU HAMIL MELAKUKAN ANTENATAL CARE DI KLINIK KEDATON TAHUN 2021

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ABSTRAK

Latar Belakang: Asuhan *Antenatal Care*(ANC) penting sehingga komplikasi obstetri yang mungkin terjadi selama kehamilan dideteksi secara dini serta ditangani secara memadai. Patuh dalam melakukan ANC dapat mencegah kematian maternal. Cakupan kunjungan ibu hamil (K4) di Daerah Istimewa Yogyakarta sebesar 89,31% dengan target RENSTRA sebesar 95%.

Tujuan: Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk mengetahui hubungan dukungan suami dengan kepatuhan ibu hamil melakukan *Antenatal care* (ANC) di Klinik Kedaton.

Metode: Penelitian ini akan menggunakan jenis penelitian survai analitik dan menggunakan desain *retrospective*. Populasi dalam penelitian ini adalah seluruh ibu hamil Trimester III yang berkunjung di Klinik Kedaton. Sampel penelitian ibu hamil Trimester III yang berkunjung di Klinik Kedaton yang teridentifikasi dari buku KIA pada saat nifas pada bulan April 2021-Juni 2021. Analisis bivariat pada penelitian ini menggunakan uji *chi-square* dengan skala data nominal.

Hasil: Sebagian besar umur ibu 20-35 tahun (85,4%), pendidikan ibu SMA/SMK (73,2%) dan usia suami 26-30 tahun (36,6%). Presentase dukungan suami sebagian besar mendukung (73,2%) dan kunjungan *antenatal care* sebagian besar patuh (75,6%). Terdapat hubungan antara dukungan suami dengan kepatuhan ANC di Klinik Kedaton ($P=0,013$). Nilai *odds ratio* 7,8 ($OR>1$) artinya dukungan suami yang tidak mendukung merupakan faktor risiko 8 kali lebih besar terjadi tidak patuh melakukan ANC dibandingkan ibu hamil yang memiliki dukungan suami mendukung.

Kesimpulan: Ada hubungan dukungan suami dengan kepatuhan ibu hamil melakukan ANC di Klinik Kedaton.

**THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN HUSBAND'S SUPPORT AND
PREGNANT WOMEN'S ADHERENCE TO ANTENATAL CARE AT THE
KEDATON CLINIC IN 2021**

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ABSTRACT

Background: Antenatal care (ANC) is important so that obstetric complications that may occur during pregnancy are early detected and adequately treated. Adherence to ANC can prevent maternal death. The coverage of visits by pregnant women (K4) in the Special Region of Yogyakarta is 89.31% with a RENSTRA target of 95%.

Objective: This study aims to determine the relationship of husband's support with pregnant women's adherence to Antenatal care (ANC) at the Kedaton Clinic.

Methods: This study used an analytic survey type of research and used a retrospective design. The population in this study was all third trimester pregnant women who visited the Kedaton Clinic. The sample of the study was third trimester pregnant women who visited the Kedaton Clinic who were identified from the KIA book during childbirth in April 2021-June 2021. Bivariate analysis in this study used the chi-square test with a nominal data scale.

Results: Most of the mothers were 20-35 years old (85.4%), the mother's education was SMA/SMK (73.2%) and the husband's age was 26-30 years (36.6%). The percentage of husband's support was mostly supportive (73.2%) and most of the antenatal care visits were obedient (75.6%). This means that there was a relationship between husband's support and ANC adherence at the Kedaton Clinic, with p-value was 0.013 ($p<0.05$). The odds ratio value was 7.8 ($OR>1$). Unsupportive husband's support was eight times greater risk factor for non-adherence to ANC than pregnant women who have supportive husband's support.

Conclusion: There was a relationship between husband's supports with pregnant women's adherence to Antenatal care (ANC) at the Kedaton Clinic.
